The meeting was called to order at 4:35 p.m.

I. Announcement of Compliance

Ms. Horne read the following statement:

It is hereby announced and recorded that the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act as to proper notification of time and place of meeting have been satisfied.

The Open Public Meetings Act, or Sunshine Law, requires that the Board notify the public of impending meetings, and that it conduct those meetings in public. It does not require participation in those meetings.

The Board has published procedures to offer members of the public and members of the campus community opportunities to address issues relevant to the Board's powers and duties. Requests to speak to the agenda items must be registered at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting. Request to speak to other items relevant to the Board's powers and duties must be submitted in writing one week prior to the Board meeting, and should specify in detail the nature of the topic and comments. Forms to register are available in the Office of the President. These procedures are designed to encourage the orderly conduct of the Board's business, to support duly established College relationships, and to ensure that thoughtful discourse characterizes the Board's deliberation.

Comments from persons registered to speak are limited to a reasonable length of time. Members of the public may not make motions. The Board may choose, after hearing a comment, to refer the issue to committee, to refrain from action entirely, or to defer discussion to a more appropriate time.

- WHEREAS: The Vice President for Administration and Finance, with the approval of the President, has reviewed with the Finance Committee of the Trenton State College Board of Trustees the FY 1995 operating budget request prepared in accordance with the FY 1995 Department of Higher Education planning guidelines; and
- WHEREAS: The Finance Committee of the Board has recommended its approval;
- THEREFORE, BE
IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees approves the FY 1995 Educational and General Operations budget request of \$72,067,000 and directs the President to transmit this request to the Board of Higher Education.

FY 1995 CAPITAL BUDGET REQUEST,
TOTALING \$64,236,000

- WHEREAS: Under 18A:64-6, the Trenton State College Board of Trustees has the power and duty to: "Study the educational and financial needs of the college; annually acquaint the Governor and Legislature with the condition of the college; and prepare, and after concurrence by and jointly with the Board of Higher Education, present the annual budget to the Governor and Legislature in accordance with law;" and
- WHEREAS: This budget request must be submitted in accordance with planning guidelines promulgated by the Department of Higher Education; and
- WHEREAS: The Vice President for Administration and Finance, with the approval of the President, has reviewed with the Finance Committee of the Trenton State College Board of Trustees the FY 1995 capital budget request prepared in accordance with the FY 1995 Department of Higher Education planning guidelines; and
- WHEREAS: The Finance Committee of the Board has recommended its approval;
- THEREFORE, BE
IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees approves the FY 1995 capital budget request of \$64,236,000 and directs the President to transmit this request to the Board of Higher Education.

CONSIDERATION OF A RESOLUTION OF APPROVAL FOR THE
ARMSTRONG HALL RENOVATION AND ADDITION:PHASE II PROJECT

- WHEREAS: The College administration determined in 1988 that a renovation of and an addition to Armstrong Hall would be the best means to provide a facility that met the needs of the School of Technology; and
- WHEREAS: The Board of Trustees of Trenton State College approved a combined Concept and Program Document for the addition to and renovation of Armstrong Hall in September, 1989 at a total estimated project cost of \$5,489,727, and
- WHEREAS: The Board of Higher Education in July, 1991 granted final approval to this proposed project, authorizing this project to proceed to construction as long as there was no change in scope and the construction cost remained within 10% of the approved construction cost of \$4,680,072; and
- WHEREAS: The College administration has determined this project should be deferred until there was resolution of the academic degree programs of the School of Technology; and
- WHEREAS: The Board of Higher Education approved at its January, 1993 meeting the re-designation of the academic degree program of the School of Technology as Engineering Science: and
- WHEREAS: The College administration has determined the previously recommended, but deferred construction project should now be advanced, thus the earlier prepared construction drawings and specifications have been revised to accommodate the current building codes, today's building materials and operating systems and to reflect the changes in the specific finishes and equipment necessary to support the present technology for Engineering Science instruction; and
- WHEREAS: This project total cost, as represented revised drawings and specifications, is now estimated to be \$7,352,066; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Trenton State College Board of Trustees hereby approves the major construction project, entitled the Armstrong Hall Renovation and Addition:Phase II Project at a total project cost of \$7,352,066 and as such authorizes the President to advance this project, including seeking all necessary governmental approvals, the financing for and construction thereof.

WHEREAS: The College administration has determined that the renovation and restoration of and code mandated fire safety improvements to Cromwell, Decker, Norsworthy and Centennial Residence Halls and Brewster Halls are necessary to maintain a continued provision of student residence and student development programs, including summer conferences and camps; and,

WHEREAS: The College administration has determined that the present level of on-campus undergraduate student housing is required to continue to offer a high quality undergraduate residential educational experience, while accomplishing the necessary rehabilitation of four of the existing student residence facilities; and

WHEREAS: The College administration has determined that the present level of on-campus student housing can be augmented using a town house type cluster development of new student residence halls at a total estimated project cost of \$13,620,00, and

WHEREAS: The College administration has determined that the operating expenses and the debt service repayment costs for this proposed new student housing will be fully funded from the room and board revenue derived from these new 504 student beds; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Trenton State College Board of Trustees hereby approves the major construction project planning document, entitled the Cluster Housing Project and dated August 20, 1993, at a total project cost of \$13,620,000.00 and as such authorizes the President to advance this project, including seeking all necessary governmental approvals, the financing for and construction thereof.
